Best Deal Ever! Read: Ecclesiastes 5:10-19

As goods increase, so do those who consume them. And what benefit are they to the owners? Eccles. 5:11



Proper Disposal Refrigerated Household Appliances

A Guide to Doing it right in Lawrence and Mercer Counties

What Appliances may Contain Refrigerants?

Refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, water coolers, and vending machines.

What is a Refrigerant?

A Refrigerant is a substance used for cooling. These include Chlorofluorocarbons (CFCs- phased out in 1994). Hydrochlorofluorocarbons (HCFCs- phased out in 2010), and Hydrofluorocarbons (HFCs). Freon, a registered trademark of The Chemours Company, is a type of CFC refrigerant.

What are the Environmental Concerns about Refrigerants?

CFCs and HCFCs are ozone-depleting substances as well as potent greenhouse gases. HFCs are greenhouse gases.

What are the Regulations Pertaining to Refrigerants?

- Intentionally venting refrigerant is prohibited.
- Technicians must do their best to recapture, recycle and dispose of refrigerant safely.
- Appliances that use refrigerant must be disposed of according to the EPA's disposal rules.
- Leaks must be repaired within 30 days.
- Only licensed heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) companies and technicians can purchase refrigerant.

Why should I care about Proper Appliance Disposal?

That old fridge or freezer is taking up space in your garage or basement. Replacing it could save you up to \$50 a year in energy costs and there are significant benefits for the environment and your community as well. Specifically, the proper disposal of an old fridge or freezer will:

- Reduce your household energy consumption, which will save you money and prevent greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions.
- Avoid the release of ozone depleting substances (ODS) and GHGs, which contribute to ozone depletion and climate change
- Save landfill space and energy by recycling-rather than landfilling- the metals, plastics, and glass contained in your appliance.
- **Recycling/Solid Waste** Department

- Avoid the release of used oil, which can cause damage to the liver, brain, immune system, and reproductive system.
- Avoid the release of mercury, which can lead to impairment of neurological development and other problems associated with the human nervous system.
- Avoid the release of polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs), which can have carcinogenic and non-cancerous health effects.

Do Household Appliances have Hazardous Components?

Depending on how old the appliance is, it may contain used oil, polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs), and mercury. Some units manufactured prior to 2000 have mercury containing components and those manufactured before 1979 may contain PCBs.

How do I dispose of my Refrigerated Household Appliance in an Environmental **Friendly Way?**

• Retailer Disposal Program. One of the easiest and most convenient ways to dispose of an older unit is to use a retailer disposal program when you purchase a new model. Many retailers offer this service. Another benefit- you don't have to work to remove the unit vourself.

• Bounty Program. Periodically, electric companies will accept appliances through a bounty program, where you are paid a bounty for your unit. Be sure to check with your electric company and any requirements they have (i.e. the appliance must be in working order, meet dimension requirements, etc.).

• Scrap Yards/Metal Recyclers. Most local scrap yards will accept appliances, including refrigerant-containing units. Make sure you verify any requirements the scrap yard may have, such as having the refrigerant removed beforehand or not accepting items such as dehumidifiers that contain a lot of plastic.

Special Notes

Like most trash and recycling programs, there is usually a cost associated with refrigerant containing appliance recycling. This is due to proper management of the refrigerant and the bulky nature of the items.

Some programs require the refrigerant removed beforehand. Contact your HVAC technician to determine if they offer this service. Be aware that the stickers that are often used as removal verification are not valid unless it consists of a signed statement that includes the name and address of the person who recovered it and the date that it was removed.

Work Magic With Leftover Turkey

Thanksgiving dinner leftovers in meals? Here are some suggestions: • Make turkey chili in your slow cooker: Toss some chopped turkey meat, chili beans, tomato paste, chili powder and any leftover veggies into the slow cooker. Refrigerate overnight and let the chili simmer on low until ready.

• If plain turkey sandwiches from the fridge leave you cold, how about one that's barbecued? Sauté some onions in a little butter, stir in cooked turkey and barbecue sauce until heated through, add pepper and throw it all on a split hard roll.

• Another sandwich variation: Mix together chopped olives, celery, onions, roasted peppers, capers, oregano, pepper or any other vegetables or herbs that call out to you. Mix in oil and vinegar. Split a round Italian bread loaf, pulling out some of the insides, and brush both sides with more oil and vinegar. Place turkey slices on the bottom half of the bread, then spoon the olive mixture over the turkey. Arrange provolone or Swiss cheese slices on top, then press the top bread half over it all. Cut the sandwich into wedges.

• Try a turkey stir-fry using soy sauce, rice vinegar, sesame oil, garlic and vegetables.

- Plenty of pasta dishes lend themselves to diced white turkey meat.
- A turkey sauté is quick, easy and delectable. Just heat butter and oil in a skillet until hot. Add mushrooms, onions or peppers, and cook. Then add minced garlic, a little broth, and turkey.

the years, they forgot to bring something along on a deer hunt that they needed or definitely wished they had. Many times, forgetting something is an inconvenience, but other times it can be a "show stopper" that can possibly alter your ability to hunt. Allow me to share a compilation of items I've known deer hunters to have forgotten over the years. That way, if you or someone you know is packing their clothing and gear to go deer hunting, you can use this as a "memory jogger" to make sure you (or they) have "the right stuff" when heading afield.

Let's start off with some absolute necessities. (I've personally witnessed individuals who have forgotten the following items at some point over my hunting career.) First, don't forget your hunting license. Hopefully, you're going to need your tag at some point when you get a deer and then there's always the potentially uncomfortable situation, if you get checked by a State Game Warden. They eliminated the requirement to display your hunting license on your back several years ago, but make sure it's on vour person before vou head out. Second. don't forget your firearm and the corresponding cartridges of the proper caliber. I've known hunters who have taken empty gun cases to the woods, others who completely forgot to bring cartridges, and twice I've seen individuals bring the wrong rifle cartridges. (Unfortunately, a .30-06 cartridge will not work in a 7mm-08 rifle.) Also, amongst necessities, bring a ziplock bag with some folded toilet paper, paper towels, or napkins. They can become critical, if you have to perform a bodily function while out-in-the-woods,

bring your gloves. There's a reason just about every convenience store sells over-priced gloves. Finally, I'd encourage everyone to pack some "snivel gear". That's an unofficial Army term for an extra layer of clothing you carry, that's more than what you thought you'd need, but will be very happy to have with you, if you start getting cold. (Mine is usually an insulated vest.)

Then there are the items you'll need, if you do get a deer. Remember to bring a pen to fill out your tag. Also, a knife to field dress your deer is rather important. Additionally, a pair of rubber/surgical gloves can make the evisceration process a little more efficient, while a drag rope certainly helps get your harvested deer back to your vehicle.

Finally, there are common sense safety items that you'll want to bring. If you're going to hunt from a tree stand, please remember your safety harness and use it. Take a pair of binoculars for scanning your surroundings closely and don't use your rifle scope for that purpose. You don't want to be pointing your loaded firearm at what may be another hunter moving through the woods. Remember to tell someone where you will be hunting and when you expect to be back. If you're hunting unfamiliar terrain, bring a map, compass, or GPS unit. (Don't always count on your phone, because there still isn't any cell phone service in many remote portions of PA.)

In the Army, we called it B.A.Y.S. - "Bring All Your Stuff". If you do it for deer hunting, you'll have a more enjoyable and productive hunt. ©WBB 2019
