Lederman Art

In the 1980s, a friend's mother decided to redecorate with unfamiliar modern-style furniture. She bought a small wooden table that was painted red and designed by Jeff Lederman, an Ohio artist. The table had won a prize for design in an Illinois state contest.

Lederman was a busy artist who changed interests and occupations many times. He designed logos for companies in the 1970s and furniture in the 1980s. For a

while, he put his art aside for a new career saving wildlife. He painted pictures again from 2014 to 2018 and started making digital art in 2020.

Q: I am a realtor and am fortunate enough to go into older homes with many architectural elements still intact. I've become fascinated by the elaborate antique doorknobs I see. I bought one for \$25 in an architectural salvage store last week. It appears to be brass. Do you think I got a good deal?

A: Doorknob collecting can be a lot of fun. In the early 19th century, people still opened doors with their thumbs. Their doors were fitted with wroughtiron thumb latches. Some of the earliest brass doorknobs in the U.S. started appearing around that same time. They were fixed to surface-mounted locks. Brass, bronze, pottery and glass hardware were popular in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. In the 1950s to 1970s, urban renewal programs

caused many aging Victorian houses to be destroyed, with the loss of artistic hardware. The destruction spurred the creation of the Antique Doorknob Collectors of America. Detailed information can be found at their website, www. AntiqueDoorKnobs. org. Knobs can be found in secondhand shops, at demolished building sites, flea markets, malls, online shops and auctions. It looks like what you paid is a fair price.

TIP: Bright sunlight will damage antiques by fading colors or drying wood. There are several brands of film that can be applied to your windows to cut UV rays, heat and glare.







Watermelon Salad

1 cup sliced red onion, cut lengthwise 3 tablespoons lime juice

15 cups cubed watermelon

3 cups cubed English cucumber

8 oz. package feta cheese, crumbled

1/2 cup chopped fresh cilantro

cracked black pepper, to taste

sea salt, to taste

• Place red onion slices in small bowl; pour over lime juice. Allow onions to marinate while assembling the salad. Gently combine watermelon, cucumber, feta cheese, and cilantro in large bowl; season with black pepper. Toss watermelon salad with marinated onions and season with sea salt just before serving.

Cucumber Salad

4 cucumbers, thinly sliced

- 1 small white onion, thinly sliced
- 1 cup white vinegar
- 3/4 cup white sugar
- 1/2 cup water

1 Tbsp. dried dill • Toss sliced cucumbers and onion together in large bowl. Set aside. Combine vinegar, sugar, and water in saucepan over medium-high heat; bring to a boil; pour over cucumbers and onions in bowl. Stir in dill. Cover and let marinate in refrigerator for at least 1 hour before serving.







It doesn't take much to make Memorial Day barbecues enjoyable, with delicious food and close friends and family in attendance. TF225973



1 cup plain Greek yogurt 2 cloves garlic, minced

1/4 cup feta cheese, crumbled Black pepper



- 6 cherries, pitted and chopped
- 12 ice pop molds and sticks

Cut watermelon flesh into chunks. Puree in a blender or food processor until smooth, to yield approximately 3 cups. Pour into a measuring cup or container with a spout.

Set out ice pop molds. Fill each one 3/4 full with the fresh fruit; then, pour in the watermelon puree until each mold is full. Insert ice pop sticks in molds and freeze. Serve when completely solid.

WATERMELON AND FETA SALAD WITH MINT

Serves 4

- as a side dish – 1 tablespoon rice
- wine vinegar – 2 tablespoons
- vegetable oil - 1/4 red onion,
