How can I make peace between them? - Gerry G., Manchester, New Hampshire

DEAR GERRY: I'm sorry to hear that! Introducing a new pet into an established household can be stressful for both pets and sometimes unpredictable. And any negative interactions that occur – from hissing and barking to an all-out boxing match - can make future harmony nearly impossible to achieve. One or both pets may begin to exhibit behavioral issues like aggression, soiling in the house, chewing and scratching, and more.

For the foreseeable future, you'll need to manage and monitor all interactions between Max and Nora. As soon as they begin to react negatively, they need to be separated.

Reintroduce the two gradually. I recommend taking Max for a nice, long walk before each meeting so that some of his puppy energy is worked off beforehand. Work intensively with Max on basic commands like sit, stay, lie down and come here. When Max is in the room with Nora, have him sit or lie down close to you - they don't have to meet face to face. Limit interaction time to five minutes or less at first, then gradually increase the time. ©2024 King Features Synd., Inc.



Whip Up Aunt Ina's Swedish Meatballs for the Holidays

My great-aunt Ina had no children of her own, so we always included her at holiday gatherings where we played endless rounds of Boggle and Scrabble and did lots of eating. She'd win the games, then happily drift into the kitchen to make her Swedish meatballs, a recipe passed on to her from her immigrant parents more than a century ago.



Now that she is no longer with us, we find ourselves reminiscing about her when we pull out her recipe for our Christmas Eve smorgasbord. As we do, I root around in the fridge for eggs, beef and pork, then Mom gathers spices from the cupboard. Without a word being spoken, we both have similar thoughts remembering Aunt Ina and others who gathered around the warm kitchen in Christmases past.

Heirloom recipes and special traditions make the holiday season bright for families everywhere. "And they help us slow down," says Blake, an energetic 4th-grade teacher and father of four active kids under 11.

Traditions aren't fast-moving. They call us to put our super-busy lifestyles aside and come together to do something that matters. When we prepare Grandma Signa's Julgrod (a Norwegian rice pudding), it gives me a warm, fuzzy feeling. I'm passing along something from my heritage while connecting with the most important people in my life. It's real, and that's what counts," he explained.

Find a pause during your family life to celebrate your unique traditions this month. And if you are in need of a new one, I am sharing great-aunt Ina's Swedish meatball recipe with you. We serve ours with lingonberry sauce on the side, but you might prefer topping them with your favorite gravy or even a spicy barbecue sauce! Let's get rolling ...

AUNT INA'S SWEDISH MEATBALLS - Makes 48 meatballs

- 1 pound lean ground beef
- 1 pound ground pork
- 1 egg, slightly beaten
- -1/2 cup milk
- 1 cup breadcrumbs or cracker crumbs
- 1 large onion, grated
- 1 clove garlic, finely chopped
- 1 tablespoon parsley, finely chopped
- 1 teaspoon ground allspice -11/2 teaspoons salt
- Pinch of pepper


Here's the fun: In a large bowl, let your child mix ingredients thoroughly for several minutes. Shape into firm 1-inch balls. Aunt Ina dipped her fingers in a bowl of cold water to make it easy.

Arrange on two rimmed cookie sheets. Bake at 350 F for about 30 minutes until lightly browned, rotating sheets halfway through.

COUNTRY COOKIES

CHOCOLATE CHIP

COOKIES 21/4 C. whole grain pastry flour

1/4 C. cornstarch 1 tsp. baking soda

- 1/2 tsp. salt 4 Tbsp. butter, at room
- temperature 2 oz. reduced-fat cream
- cheese, at room
- temperature 3/4 C. granulated sugar
- 3/4 C. packed light brown sugar
- 1 large egg 1 large egg white 1 tsp. vanilla extract

3/4 C. semisweet chocolate chips Preheat oven to 375°.

Coat 2 large baking sheets with cooking spray. In medium bowl, mix flour, cornstarch, baking soda, and salt. Place butter and cream cheese in large bowl. Using electric mixer on medium speed, beat for 1 minute, or until smooth. Beat in granulated and brown sugars until light and creamy. Beat in egg, egg white, and vanilla. Reduce mixer speed to low. Add flour mixture in 2 batches, beating just until combined. Stir in chocolate chips. Drop dough by rounded tsp. about 11/2" apart onto the prepared baking sheets. Bake 1 sheet at a time 9-12 minutes, or until golden. Cool on a rack for 2 minutes. Remove from sheet and place on rack to cool completely.

PARMESAN **BUTTERED RICE** 3 C. water

- $1 \frac{1}{2}$ C. uncooked long grain rice
- 1/2 C. butter. no substitutes
- 1 1/2 C. grated Parmesan
- cheese 1 Tbsp. minced fresh parsley

In large saucepan, bring water to boil: stir in rice. Reduce heat to low: cover and cook for 20 minutes or until tender. Meanwhile, in skillet over medium heat, melt butter until browned. Place rice in serving dish and sprinkle with Parmesan cheese. Pour butter over rice: cover and let stand 2-3 minutes. Sprinkle with parsley.

2 C. all-purpose flour 2 tsp. baking powder 1/2 tsp. salt 1/2 tsp. ground cloves 1/2 tsp. ground ginger 1 tsp. ground cinnamon 3/4 C. vegetable oil 1/4 C. molasses 1 C. granulated sugar 1 egg 1/2 C. raisins Confectioners' sugar In large bowl, sift together flour, baking powder, salt, cloves, ginger, and cinnamon. In medium bowl, combine oil, molasses, sugar, and egg and stir until thoroughly mixed. With electric mixer on medium speed, add to flour mixture and beat for 2-3 minutes, or until dough forms. Add raisins and stir until thoroughly mixed. Roll dough into a ball, cover with plastic wrap, and refrigerate 1 hour. Preheat oven to 350°. Evenly divide dough into thirty-six 1" balls and set them about 1" apart on a large nonstick baking sheet. Flatten each cookie by pressing gently with tines of a fork. Bake 10-12 minutes. Remove to a rack to cool. Dust with confectioners' sugar.

- CANDY BAR PIE 5 (2.07 oz.) Snickers

pastry shell; set aside. In mixing bowl, beat cream cheese and sugar until smooth. Add eggs, sour cream and peanut butter; beat on low until combined. Pour into pasty shell. Bake at 325° for 35-40 minutes or until set. Cool on wire rack. In small heavy saucepan, melt chocolate chips with cream over low heat; stir until smooth. Spread over filling. Refrigerate for 2 hours or overnight. Cut with a warm knife.

GREAT LOW-CAL OATMEAL COOKIES $1 \frac{1}{2}$ C. all-purpose flour

- 1 tsp. ground cinnamon 1 tsp. baking soda
- 1/2 tsp. salt 3 C. old-fashioned or
- quick oats
- 1 C. dark or golden raisins
- 1 C. walnuts or pecans, finely chopped
- 1/2 C. reduced-calorie, trans-free margarine
- 1/4 C. granulated sugar
- 1/4 C. firmly packed
- brown sugar
- 1/4 C. Splenda 2 large eggs or 1/2 C.
- egg substitute 3/4 C. unsweetened
- applesauce 1 tsp. vanilla extract

Preheat oven to 350°. Coat 2 or 3 heavy baking sheets with cooking spray. In large bowl, stir together flour, cinnamon, baking soda, and salt. Stir in oats, and then raisins and nuts. In another large bowl, with electric mixer at medium speed, beat together margarine, granulated and brown sugars, and Splenda until well blended. Beat in eggs, one at a time, beating well after each (or beat in one-half of the egg substitute, followed by the other half). Beat in applesauce and vanilla. With mixer at low speed, add dry ingredients, in 2 batches, just until blended. Drop dough by heaping tablespoons onto the prepared baking sheets, spacing them 1" apart. Bake until crisp and lightly brown, 10-12 minutes. Cool on sheet 1 minute. then transfer cookies to racks to cool. Repeat with remaining dough.

HAM LOAF

2 lb. ham loaf mix 2 unbeaten eggs 1 C. cracker crumbs

To these ingredients, add enough milk to make a soft loaf and mix well.

- SAUCE: 1 C. brown sugar $1 \frac{1}{2}$ C. water 1 Tbsp. mustard
- 1/2 C. vinegar

Pour over the ham loaf. Bake at 350° about 2 hours, basting often.

Through his research, he has become one of the world's foremost Awe researchers and has examined Awe's effects on our minds, bodies, and outlooks. 

PROPER RECYCLING **CURBSIDE RECYCLING IN** LAWRENCE COUNTY

A Guide to doing it right in Lawrence and Mercer Counties

What is "Curbside Recycling?"

Curbside recycling is simply having recyclables picked up at your home. It does not mean that a physical "curb" is required.

Am I Required to Recycle Curbside?

All residents and businesses of the following municipalities are required by state and local laws to recycle curbside: City of New Castle, Ellwood City Borough, Neshannock Township, Shenango Township, and Union Township.

These are called "Mandated Municipalities." Residents and businesses in New Wilmington Borough are required to recycle curbside by local laws. Residents and businesses of all other Lawrence County municipalities are not required to recycle curbside, but are encouraged to do so voluntarily. See "I live in a Municipality where I am not required to Recycle Curbside, but I would like to do so. What options do I have for curbside recycling?" for more information.

What Can I Recycle?

Most curbside recycling programs in Lawrence County collect recyclables via "single stream" recycling. Single stream recycling is designed to make recycling as easy as possible for residents. All of the materials listed below can be mixed together in the same container. There is no need to separate them. The following materials are usually included in single stream recycling programs:

- #1, #2, and sometimes #5 Plastic Bottles & Jugs
- Aluminum Cans
- Steel/Tin Cans
- Magazines
- Corrugated Cardboard
- Newspaper
- Paperboard (cereal boxes, etc.)
- Junk Mail

There may be differences in programs depending on where you live. **Always check with** your recycling hauler or municipality if you have questions about your program.

If it is not on the list - it belongs in the trash. When in doubt, throw it out or recycle it elsewhere. Acceptable materials may differ between haulers. Be sure to follow the guidelines provided by your hauler!

What are the advantages of curbside recycling over a drop-off recycling program?

Curbside Recycling is:

EASY - All materials can be mixed together in the same container.

CONVENIENT - You can do it at your own home without making a special trip to a recycling site.

ENVIRONMENTALLY FRIENDLY - No more using your gas to go to a recycling site. We estimate that 400,000 cars use the county recycling drop-off sites annually consuming about 48,000 gallons of fuel in the process.







I live in a municipality where I am not required to recycle curbside, but I would like to do so. What options do I have for curbside recycling?

Effective October 9, 2014, all haulers providing regular trash collection services are required to provide recycling services to residents that request it but do not live in a Mandated Municipality. This requirement is for haulers only. Residents are not required to request the service and may decline it if offered. There may be additional fees for recycling. To summarize: if you want to recycle curbside at your home, your hauler must provide you with the service.

What kind of recycling bin can I use for curbside recycling?

Recycling bins vary. Some haulers and municipalities will provide you with a container. You can also purchase your own container through a local hardware or department store. Wheeled containers and carts are easy to move and provide adequate room for all your recyclables. Additionally, wheeled carts have lids that prevent litter and keep recyclables dry. Traditional bins may be used as well but are prone to accidental littering in windy conditions.

What about Plastic Bags, Toys, Windows, etc.?

These items do not belong in your recycling bin. Plain and simple. Plastic bags can be recycled at some local stores. Items such as plastic toys, chairs, and food containers and glass windows, ceramics, and Pyrex all go into your trash. If it is not a bottle, jug, can, jar or clean piece of paper, it does not belong in your bin. Including items not listed for recycling contaminates your recyclables and significantly increases the cost because all contaminates must be removed before the material can be recycled.

What about Leaves?

All Mandated Municipalities, including New Wilmington, offer leaf waste collection. Contact your municipality for details.

What about Electronics, Paint, Chemicals, Fluorescent Lights, Tires, etc.?

Local options do exist for these items. Check out the Lawrence-Mercer Recycling Solid Waste Department website, www.co.lawrence.pa.us/ recycling for information about these materials. Click the "Calendar of Events" link for a listing of planned events that serve our area.

SNACK CAKE 13/4 C. boiling water 1 C. quick-cooking oats 1/2 C. butter, softened 1 C. sugar 1 C. packed brown

- sugar 2 eggs 13/4 C. all-purpose

Bake at 350° for 40-45 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean. Cool on wire rack.

GOLDEN RAISIN BRAN MUFFINS 1 C. unsweetened

- applesauce 1/3 C. vegetable oil 1/4 C. milk 1 egg, lightly beaten 1 C. All-Bran
 - 3/4 C. all-purpose flour 3/4 C. whole wheat flour 1/3 C. packed brown
- sugar 3 tsp. baking powder 1 tsp. ground cinnamon 1/2 tsp. baking soda 1/4 tsp. salt

1/2 C. golden raisins

In bowl, combine applesauce, oil, milk and egg. Sitr in bran: let stand for 5 minutes. In another bowl, combine flours, brown sugar, baking powder, cinnamon, baking soda and salt; stir in bran mixture just until blended. Fold in raisins (batter will be thick). Fill greased or paper-lined muffin cups 2/3 full. Bake at 375° for 15-20 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean. Cool 5 minutes before removing from pan to wire rack. Serve warm.

- 1/4 tsp. baking soda 1/4 tsp. salt
- 2 eggs 1/2 C. sour cream 1/4 C. butter, melted
- 1/4 tsp. almond extract
- 3/4 C. sliced almonds, divided
- 1/2 C. whole-berry cranberry sauce

In bowl, combine flour. sugar, baking powder, baking soda and salt. In another bowl, whisk eggs, sour cream, butter and extract; stir into dry ingerdients just until moistened. Fold in 1/2 C. almonds. Fill greased or paper-lined muffin cups 1/2 full; drop 1 Tbsp. cranberry sauce into the center of each muffin. Cover with enough batter to fill cups 3/4 full; sprinkle with remaining almonds. Bake at 375° for 20-25 minutes or until toothpick inserted 1" from edge comes out clean. Cool for 5 minutes before removing from pan to wire rack. Serve warm.

Cream 2 cups sugar and oil. Add eggs one at a time. Add carrots, flour and salt and stir. Stir in nuts and bake in 8" tube pan for 1 hour and 15 minutes at 350°. Hot Glaze: heat orange juice and 1 cup sugar. Bring to a full boil. Turn baked cake upside down on serving plate. Slowly spoon filling over top and sides of cake. Repeat until all glaze has soaked in cake.



PROPER 🍊 RECYCLING RECYCLING RIGHT

A Guide to doing it right in Lawrence and Mercer Counties

What to toss into your recycling bin can be confusing. It is important that residents and businesses follow the rules, policies, and guidelines established for their local programs.

What Can I Recycle?

Always check with your recycling hauler or municipality about what can be recycled in your program. What may be acceptable for one municipality, may be different for a neighboring municipality. In general, most programs accept:

- #1 & #2 Plastic Bottles.
- Metal Cans (Aluminium, Steel, and Bi-metal), and
- Clean Paper (Cardboard, Magazines, Newspaper).
- Some programs may accept:
- Junk Mail
- Glass Bottles and Jars

Plastic is the most confusing material because it comes in a variety of forms and resins that are chemically different. People often think that because something is "plastic" that it is recyclable. This is not the case. The same holds true with the "recycling" symbol and number commonly found on plastic items. The purpose of the symbol and number is to indicate the resin type. It has nothing to do with recycling!

Instead, focus on the shape of the item. When it comes to recycling, think "plastic bottles/jugs, metal cans, and clean paper." If you're holding a plastic item, consider if it is a bottle. For example, butter tubs, yogurt containers, and clam-shell/take-out food containers are plastic and usually have a recycling symbol and number on them. But - they are not a bottle/jug and belong in the trash. When in doubt, throw it out,

1. Always check with your recycling hauler if you have questions about your program.

2. There may be differences between programs depending on where you live.

"Wishcycling" and Contamination

Contamination occurs when people put trash/ unacceptable materials into the recycling program. "Wishcycling" occurs when people mean well, but unintentionally hurt recycling programs by placing the wrong materials into their bins. Examples include plastic toys, food containers, tubing, or buckets. These and similar items put into recycling bins must be physically removed and then landfilled. It is estimated that up to 20% of the cost of recycling is used to deal with items that should have been placed in the trash. Items that are not listed as recyclable WILL NOT get recycled. This includes plastic bags.

Preparation

A simple rinse of food/beverage bottles and jugs is all that is needed. Cardboard should be flattened and mixed papers (magazines, junk mail, newspapers) can be placed in your bin loosely or in a brown paper bag. Do not put any materials in plastic bags! Plastic bags must be ripped open. And loose bags jam conveyor belts and gears. They are a significant cost to manage when they get into the system. Plastic bags will not get recycled at the recycling center. Many local grocers accept plastic bags for recycling. Greasy pizza boxes and other food contaminated materials belong in the trash. Residents committed to recycling may rip off and recycle a clean lid, while placing the dirty bottom in their trash.
